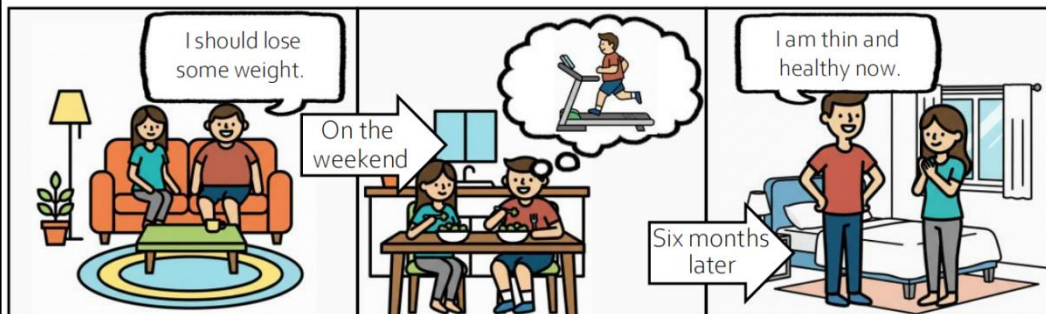


Urban Farming
